Student seeks change in Urban book buy back

At least one student at the Urban Center (U.C.) is upset about the book buy-back procedures.

Ray Wessel, U.C. student, maintains that the DMACC book store is treating Urban students unfairly.

Presently, the book buy-back takes place on the Ankeny campus at the end of the quarter during daytime hours.

Wessel believes a separate book buy-back should be held at the U.C. bookstore during evening hours to better accommodate students there.

Wessel said since students buy their books at the Urban bookstore, they should also be able to sell them there. "Ankeny students don't buy their books at one place and resell them at another," he said.

"Many U.C. students can't find transportation out to the Ankeny campus," Wessel said, "or they can't take time off from work during the day to stand in line for hours to sell their books back."

Wessel said he can't understand why Bill Brownell, who operates the U.C. bookstore, couldn't be instructed in book buy-back procedures. That way, he added, Joe Morr, Ankeny bookstore manager, wouldn't have to work overtime.

"But Morr said he wants to be present personally at the buy-back proceedings, which is why he doesn't have Brownell do it," Wessel said. "Does that mean that no one else can handle the book buy-back? If Joe Morr was sick at the end of the quarter and in the hospital, would they cancel the book buy-back because he couldn't be there?"

Joe Morr said he doesn't conduct a book buy-back at the Urban Center bookstore because, "I can't be two places at once." He said evening hours would involve overtime work for him.

Morr said he could instruct Brownell in buy-back procedures but added, "I don't want to." One reason he gave was that it would involve carrying too much money and the U.C. bookstore has been broken into two or three times.

Morr disagreed that the daytime hours were that much

of an inconvenience for U.C. students.

"Night students manage to make it out here for the book buy-back," he said.

Wessel talked to Superintendent Paul Lowery about the situation. Lowery said he would look into it and see if the present book buy-back procedure is enough of an inconvenience to U.C. students to warrant any changes.

Parking appeals

The Parking Appeals Court will meet on Mondays from noon to 1 p.m. in Bldg. 25, room 2509 during the Summer Quarter.

Bill Brownell, chairman of the Parking Appeals Court, said students are needed to serve as Board members for the summer.

Parking lots enlarged

Various paving projects to be completed this summer total \$162,000, according to Don Zuck, physical plant director.

The biggest project is the asphaltting and enlarging of the gravel parking lot west of Bldg. 21. Zuck said the lot should be done by the start of Fall Quarter and when completed, it will include lighting and 320 spaces, 100 more than the old lot.

Also the four-lane road is to

be extended to the entrance of the new lot west of Bldg. 21.

A smaller paving project involves enlarging the parking lot south of Bldg. 31, doubling the number of spaces set aside there for the handicapped.

Zuck said another separate project to be completed soon is the campus graphics project. This includes maps situated at the college's main entrances with erects at the side of the road for motorists to pull over.

Student takes second in skills contest

David Hade, Building Trades student, won second place in cabinetmaking in the National Skills Olympics held in Miami, Florida in June.

Hade was the only DMACC contestant to place in the national contests sponsored by the Vocational Industrial Clubs of America (VICA), according to Duane Van Hemert, Building Trades instructor. Twelve students from DMACC attended the national contests.

Hade's project in the competition was to build a small footstool using hand tools. "This involves complicated cutting angles and fitting joints," Van Hemert said.

As a second place winner in his division, Hade would have been eligible to compete the International Skills

Contest to be held in the Netherlands next June. However, Van Hemert said, only nine skill divisions are taken to that contest and cabinetmaking wasn't one of them.

"I'm extremely proud of Dave. He did a fine job," Van Hemert said. "It exemplifies the work he's done throughout the program."

Hade graduates in September and plans to work for a contractor in Ames.

I looked at her haughtily and replied, "Of course I read the Handbook." (Actually, the only one I had I tried to sell back to the bookstore after my first quarter.)

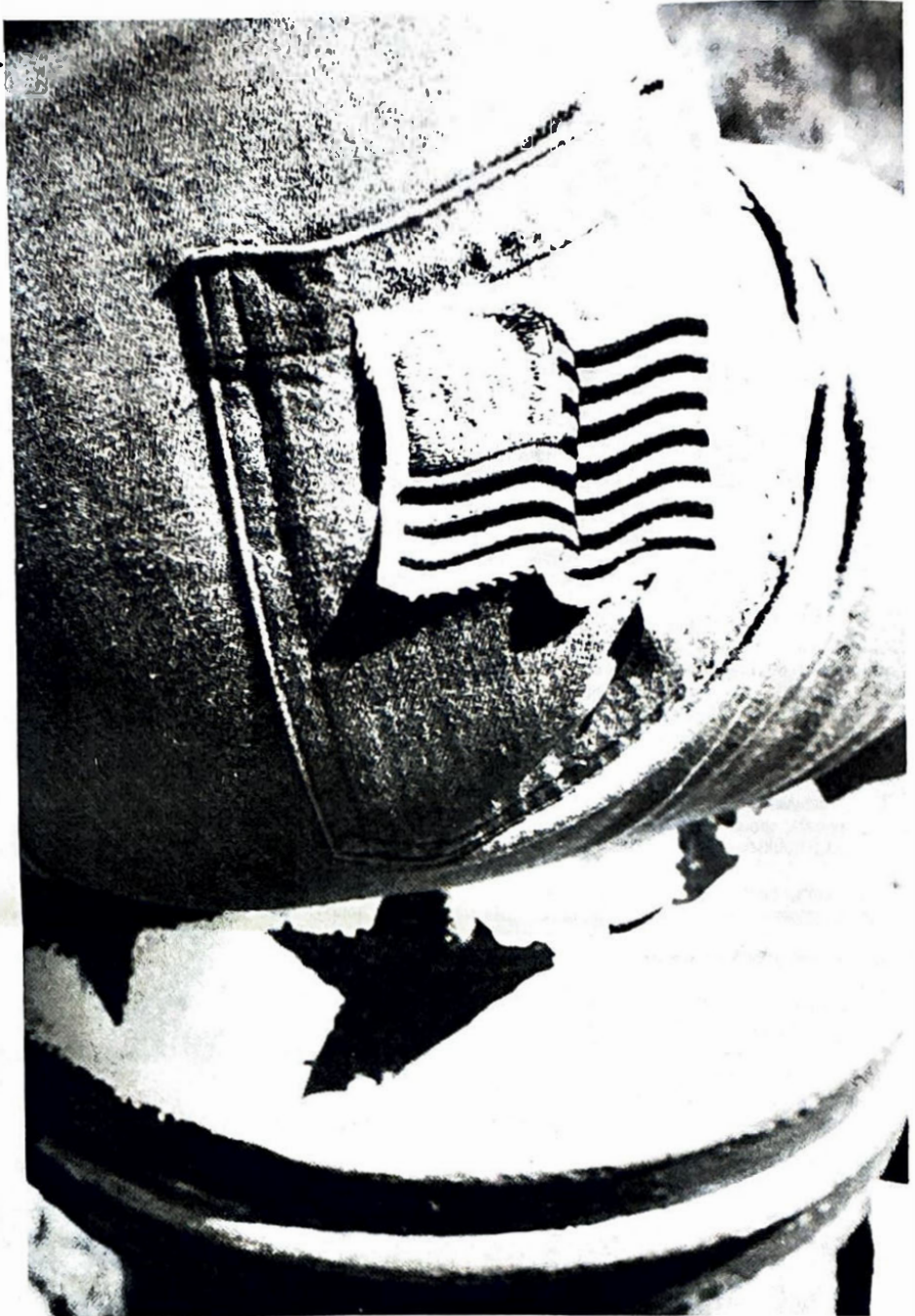
After I finally got the classes I wanted, I wondered why I tried so hard to carry a full schedule. Those instructors really pour it on, squandering three months work into eight weeks.

Three Career Days are planned for next year, one is scheduled for February or March for Spring Quarter graduates.

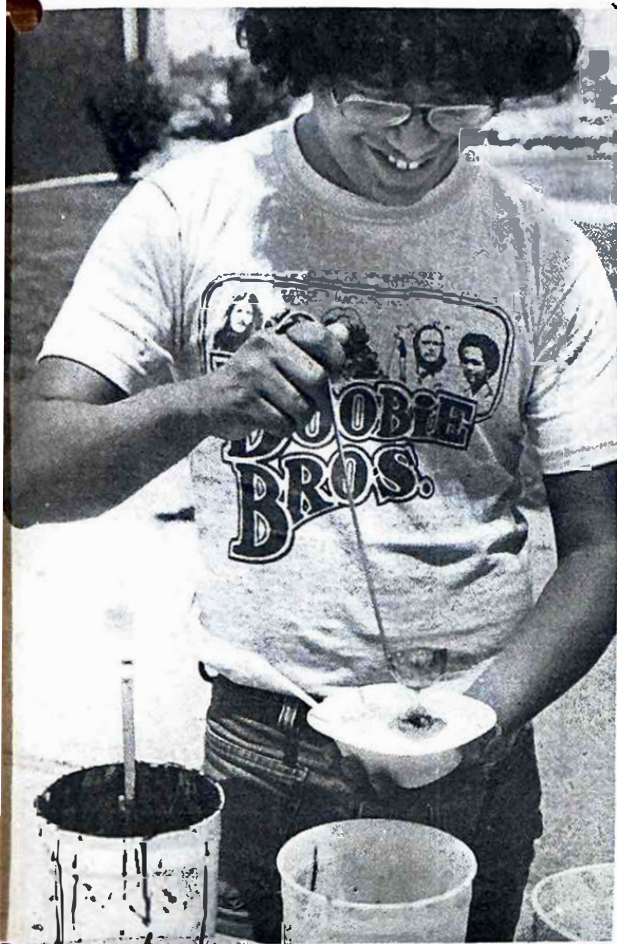
